## <u>Group 04-Prince William Co., VA and IL – Original</u> <u>Surname Probably Wroe</u>

The Most Recent Common Ancestor of the three Blands who tested into **Group 04** has been determined to be John Bland of Prince William County, VA (see G04.1). However, DNA evidence proves that the ancestral father ("Old John") was not a Bland male. Traditional genealogical evidence seems to suggest that his mother was a female in the **Group 02** family. This female could have been a single woman (the daughter of a Bland) or a married woman (the wife of a Bland). Although "Old John" is the most distant proven ancestor of one of our DNA examples, it is still possible that the NPE occurred a generation or two before him, i.e., with his mother or grandmother. Research has offered some hints, but not positive identification of either the Wroe father or the Bland mother.

**G04.CThe Wroe Connection**DNA matches showed up for the first time for **Group 04** in 2016. Not Blands, however, these men are from two different Wroe lines--Original Wroe (1697-1774 of Westmoreland Co., VA) and Absalom Wroe (ca1758-1834 of VA and Washington, D. C.), both of whom had ties to Prince William County, VA. As **Lawton** is from the Original Wroe line and is the most closely matched to our Blands, it is assumed that the non-paternity event (NPE) occurred in the Original line.
